

When I was young my dad bought a house in Zacapa, tierra caliente as the song says, and some of the best memories I have are from that time. We had many pets including a cat, a dog, and a dove, and several other animals and bugs that just roamed around our house. There was a river in front of the house and I would go horseback riding, swimming, and fishing. This is one of the few memories I treasure living with my dad since we lost him to a heart attack when he was barely 40 years old.

I grew up really close to them and they helped me grow really close to God. My dad's youngest sister and her husband took me under their embrace. It is through them that I was able to visit the USA, not knowing that 10 years later I would earn a few degrees in the subjects that interest me the most.

I remember that every single morning, right before getting up from his bed, my dad would read the Bible and compare it to other versions he had. Little did I know that I was going to be in Texas during those 10 years, fully immersed in missions, working with our immigrant Hispanic families, while getting a degree in biblical and theological studies. This is why my interests continue to be diverse and I enjoy when I get to meet



new people along our lives' paths. I believe we are all missionaries wherever we are, as long as we remember who called us to Him.
